Guidance Information

- 1 All tasks must be carried out in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 2 Definition
Enterprise procedures – procedures used by the organisation carrying out the work and applicable to the tasks being carried out. Examples are – standard operating procedures, safety procedures, equipment operating procedures, codes of practice, quality management practices and standards, procedures to comply with legislative and local body requirements.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Prepare to repair or overhaul aircraft weapons release units.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Task is determined by reviewing maintenance documentation and manuals.
- 1.2 Weapons release unit serial and part numbers are matched with documentation.
- 1.3 Resources are obtained and checked for serviceability or status.

Range may include but is not limited to – manuals, materials, tools, equipment, safety equipment, work area selected for task, prepared and cleaned.

1.4 Weapons release unit defects are located prior to disassembly.

Range any explosives removed, inspected, troubleshooting carried out, tested, economics of carrying out repair or overhaul assessed.

Outcome 2

Repair or overhaul aircraft weapons release units.

Performance criteria

2.1 Weapons release units are disassembled.

Range cleaned, inspected, labelled, preserved, segregated.

2.2 Defects found during disassembly are reported or recorded.

2.3 Rectification action is determined, confirmed, and recorded.

Range repair, overhaul, replace, modify, adjust, scrap.

2.4 Replacement parts are procured and verified as authentic and serviceable.

Range identify, inspect.

2.5 Defects are rectified.

Range mechanical, electrical.

2.6 Weapons release units are assembled.

2.7 Weapons release units are tested and adjusted.

Range functionally tested, calibrated and/or adjusted.

2.8 Supervisory inspections are obtained.

Outcome 3

Complete tasks related to the repair or overhaul of aircraft weapons release units.

Performance criteria

3.1 Units are prepared.

Range may include but is not limited to – use, storage, transit, locked, inhibited, blanked, packed.

3.2 Resources are checked for serviceability and returned to service or storage.

Range may include but is not limited to – manuals, tools, equipment, safety equipment.

3.3 Leftover parts and materials are disposed of.

Range may include but is not limited to – serviceable, unserviceable, surplus, waste, scrap, hazardous.

3.4 Documentation is completed.

Range may include but is not limited to – labels, work orders, logbooks, shelf-life requirements recorded, certification obtained.

3.5 Work area is left in a clean and tidy state.
