- 1 This unit standard is intended for people working in the embroidery industry.
- 2 Competence will be demonstrated on the type of machine installed in the candidate's workplace.
- 3 Competence will be demonstrated on a range of products produced in the candidate's workplace.
- 4 Performance of the elements must comply with the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992.

5 Definitions

Product specifications refer to the documentation that accompanies each product order. This documentation sets out the fabric to be used, the marking methods to be used, and the embroidery equipment to be used, and the quantity of goods required. *Workplace procedures* refer to the verbal or documented procedures for performing work activities and include health and safety, operational, environmental, and quality management requirements. They may refer to manuals, manufacturer's specifications, codes of practice, or policy statements.

Elements and performance criteria

Element 1

Identify and remove stains and marks in embroidered goods.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Stains and marks are identified, and cleaning methods are selected and used according to type of stain and fabric.
- Range cleaning method is appropriate for stain or mark and fabric.
- 1.2 Solvents and cleaning chemicals are used according to workplace procedures.

Element 2

Finish and pack embroidered goods.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Finishing checks are carried out according to workplace procedures.
- Range threads trimmed, backing fabric removed, final inspection carried out.
- 2.2 Finished goods meet product specifications and product order is assembled.
- Range correct quantity and types of items.
- 2.3 Goods are ticketed and packed according to workplace procedures.

Please note

Providers must be accredited by NZQA, or an inter-institutional body with delegated authority for quality assurance, before they can report credits from assessment against unit standards or deliver courses of study leading to that assessment.

Industry Training Organisations must be accredited by NZQA before they can register credits from assessment against unit standards.

Accredited providers and Industry Training Organisations assessing against unit standards must engage with the moderation system that applies to those standards.
