4 Definitions

Health or wellbeing setting includes but is not limited to – the aged care, acute care, community support, disability, mental health, social services, and youth development sectors.

Organisational policies and procedures – policies, procedures, and methodologies of an organisation. They include legislative and regulatory requirements which may apply across an organisation, a specific site, or a workplace. Requirements are

documented in organisational health and safety plans, contract work programmes, quality assurance programmes, policies, and procedural documents.

Risk management plan is a document that outlines the procedures and strategies for managing risks. It may be related to hazards, people, equipment or environment. It provides a detailed approach to preparing for and responding to potential risk.
