- 2 *Verbal and visual/dramatic techniques* refer to the techniques applicable to the chosen medium in the relevant sections of the curriculum resource support document *Exploring Language: A Handbook for Teachers*, Learning Media, Ministry of Education, 1996.
- 3 The purpose of the third criterion in each grade is to establish the deliberate intentions of the student to incorporate identified effects into their own production. It is not expected that a full critical appreciation and analysis is supplied. Identification of techniques and explanation of intended effects may be through:
 - annotated draft notes/sketches
 - oral commentary
 - written notes
 - learning log
 - video commentary
 - annotated photographic record
 - hyperlinks established.
- 4 *Constructing* means that the student develops their own content for the presentation.
- 5 *Producing* could include designing, making, presenting, performing, participating in, contributing significantly to the production/presentation.
- 6 Possible contexts include the production of:
 - static image such as a poster, advertisement, newspaper front page or storyboard
 - moving image such as a video, PowerPoint display
 - dramatic presentation such as a role play, performance of a poem or scene from a play
 - radio show
 - multi-media presentation.
