### **Explanatory Notes**

- A designed *landscape plan that reflects user requirements* is one that satisfies user needs. This will typically include the position of key features and some explanation for these locations.

A designed *landscape plan that meets user requirements* demonstrates how user needs are met in a functional manner. This will typically include reference to the linkages between features and the impact that environmental factors have on their locations.

A designed *landscape plan that comprehensively meets user requirements* is justified in terms of functionality. This will typically include comparing and contrasting location and attributes of hard and soft landscape features.

- 3 The site could cover large or small-scale sites eg home gardens, recreational and leisure areas.
- 4 The *user* is either an individual or specific group of individuals eg a family or school community that makes most use of the site.
- 5 *User requirements* are those determined by the user of the site and may include but are not limited to: access, privacy, shelter, shade, aesthetics, recreation, entertainment, production, utility, budget constraints.
- 6 Functional and functionality refer to the facilitation of user requirements. This involves consideration of scale and environmental factors.
