- 3 Art works may include: paintings, drawings, sculptures, installations, prints, collages, architecture, handcrafted objects, film, animation, photographs, digital images, whakairo, kōwhaiwhai, tukutuku, tapa cloth.
- Theory refers to a set of principles and ideas which can be examined in relation to art, which may include: Platonism, Humanism, Neoplatonism, Marxism, Theosophy, Utopianism, Neoplasticism, Psychoanalytical theory (e.g. Freudian, Jungian), Existentialism, Feminism, Post-Colonialism.
- 5 Relationship(s) between a theory and art works refers to the links between the ideas expressed in a theory and the evidence of those ideas in art works. It may also refer to the way ideas expressed in art works may influence theory.
