- 3 A drama or theatre theorist is a person whose writing and/or practice has been innovative and influential in shaping world theatre.
- 4 A practitioner is a person who has (or has had) a significant influence on the development of theatre or drama practice.
- 5 Applying refers to implementation in a presentation or practical demonstration of knowledge and understanding gained through research and practical exploration.
