Demonstrate in-depth understanding involves explaining the key arguments of a psychological debate. The explanation includes descriptions of, or references to, psychological theories or studies.

Demonstrate comprehensive understanding involves giving a thorough explanation of the interaction of the key arguments of a psychological debate. The explanation will show the importance of each side of the debate.

- 3 *A psychological debate is a discussion with multiple points of view. These views can be mutually exclusive or interact. Examples of debates include:*
- Free Will and Determinism
 - Individual and Situational explanations
 - Nature and Nurture
 - Reductionism and Holism.
