2 *Demonstrate understanding* involves identifying and describing at least three methods used in psychological research.

Demonstrate in-depth understanding involves explaining the reasons and appropriateness of the researchers' choice of the methods used in the psychological research.

Demonstrate comprehensive understanding involves giving a thorough explanation of the researchers' choice of the methods used in the psychological research. The explanation includes a comparison of the different methods and a justification of why these methods were used.

- 3 *Methods* used in psychological research are the specific tools, techniques and processes psychologists use to investigate, develop and test theories. Examples of methods include:
 - case studies
 - correlations
 - experiments
 - observations
 - surveys.
 - 4 *Psychological research* is a study from a recognised academic journal or equivalent publication, or a summary of an academic study, and is one where the design can be determined and analysed.
