Analyse, in depth, involves critiquing how two or more theories have had an impact within a context in the field of psychological practice. The critique includes descriptions of, or references to, psychological theory, concepts and/or studies from published works.

Comprehensively analyse involves a detailed critique focusing on the effectiveness of how two or more theories are applied within a context in the field. The detailed critique includes how the application of these theories has impacted on wider society. For example social justice, political, education and health systems.

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3 Field of psychological practice refers to a real life setting. Examples of fields of psychological practice include:

- clinical
- developmental
- human factors (industrial)
- organisational
- forensic
- health
- sports
- comparative
- media
- environmental
- educational
- social
- cultural.
- 4 Theory refers to psychological ideas that describe, explain or predict behaviour or mental processes. For example, the theory of operant conditioning is relevant to the field of educational psychology and Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs is used in the field of industrial and organisational psychology.
