• explaining how the characteristic is applied within the religious or spiritual traditions.

Examine a characteristic of religious or spiritual traditions involves:

• examining connections between the characteristic and how it is applied within the religious or spiritual traditions.

2 A *characteristic* of a religious or spiritual tradition is a set of behaviours, structured practice, or form of communication that is commonly associated with a specific religion. Some religious or spiritual groups might use the terms 'features' or 'elements' to describe what is defined here as characteristics.

Characteristics of religious or spiritual traditions include:

- rituals
- beliefs
- moral and ethical teachings
- experiences
- social organisation
- material expression.
