Explanatory Notes

- 1 Demonstrate understanding of a science-informed response to a local issue involves:
 - describing a science idea that informs a science perspective involved in the issue
 - outlining another perspective relevant to the issue
 - identifying a science-informed response to the issue.

Explain a science-informed response to a local issue involves:

- explaining the science idea that informs the science perspective relevant to the issue
- explaining another perspective relevant to the issue
- explaining the science-informed response to the issue.

Analyse a science-informed response to a local issue involves:

- discussing the importance of the science-informed perspective and the other perspective in the science-informed response to the issue.
- 2 As part of the evidence provided, students must show understanding of tiakitanga in the context of responsible science practice in the local issue. In this achievement standard, the tiakitanga approach is one that demonstrates taking care, ownership, or responsibility, in response to the issue.
- 3 A *local issue* is a topic about which people hold varying perspectives. *Local* refers to the issue being of interest or importance to the student.
- 4 For the purpose of this achievement standard, a *perspective* is a particular way of regarding an issue that is shared by a group.

Examples of groups include:

- iwi or hapū
- a local council
- a company or business.
- 5 Refer to the NCEA <u>glossary</u> for Māori, Pacific, and further subject-specific terms and concepts.
- 6 This achievement standard is derived from the Science Learning Area at Level 6 of *The New Zealand Curriculum*: Learning Media, Ministry of Education, 2007.
