***EITHER:* QUESTION ONE: LEADERSHIP AND POWER**

In the ancient world, maintaining power was sometimes more challenging than acquiring power.

Analyse the ways in which a significant historical figure's social relationships¹ affected their ability to acquire and maintain their power.

In your answer:

- Discuss the nature of the historical figure's social relationships that affected their rise to power.
- Evaluate the extent to which those relationships helped and/or hindered their ability to maintain their power over time.
- Provide primary source evidence to support your analysis.

¹ *Social relationships may be public or private and may refer to relationships with relatives, friends, allies, rivals.*

***OR:* QUESTION TWO: SOCIAL AND POLITICAL CHANGE**

Often the greatest change comes about when individuals challenge established ideas and values.²

Analyse the ways in which the actions taken by a significant historical figure brought about social and/or political change.

In your answer:

- Discuss the ways in which this historical figure challenged ideas and values, and the reasons why they did so.
- Evaluate the extent to which these actions influenced individuals and/or the society in which the historical figure lived to bring about social and/or political change.
- Provide primary source evidence to support your analysis.

² *Ideas and values may refer to warfare, politics, religion, philosophy, ethics, education, science.*

OR: QUESTION THREE: CULTURE AND IDENTITY

In the ancient world, cultural identity might be reinforced or challenged by political, religious, or philosophical programmes.³

Analyse the extent to which a significant historical figure's political, religious, and/or philosophical programmes reinforced and/or challenged cultural identity.

In your answer:

- Discuss the reasons for and the nature of the political, religious, and/or philosophical programmes established by your chosen historical figure.
- Evaluate the extent to which these programmes reinforced and/or challenged cultural identity.
- Provide primary source evidence to support your analysis.

³ Programmes may refer to policies, moral cause / purpose.

OR: QUESTION FOUR: POLITICAL AND RELIGIOUS IDEOLOGIES

Religious ideas are sometimes adapted or exploited by leaders to promote their own agendas.

Analyse the ways in which a significant historical figure adapted or exploited religious ideas to promote their own social, ethical, or political programmes.

In your answer:

- Discuss the religious ideas that the historical figure adapted or exploited, and the social, ethical, or political programmes that they used these ideas to promote.
- Evaluate the extent to which the historical figure was successful in promoting and/or implementing their social, ethical, or political programmes.
- Provide primary source evidence to support your analysis.
