You may answer using short and/or extended paragraphs, and may support your answer with bullet points, diagrams, and/or annotated sketches.

You must support your answer with relevant evidence from the named classical literary text.

EITHER: QUESTION ONE

Examine the actions of a leader in a classical literary text.

In your answer:

- Examine the key actions of a leader in one event(s) in your chosen text, and reasons for these actions.
- Draw developed conclusions about whether the character's actions result from his need to be recognised as a leader within society and/or simply because of who he is and what he believes in.

OR: QUESTION TWO

Examine the beliefs* held by one or more characters in a classical literary text.

In your answer:

- Examine the beliefs of a prominent character(s) in your chosen text.
- Draw developed conclusions about the impact these beliefs have on your chosen character(s) **and** other characters in the text.

* *Beliefs may be political, or religious, or social, or cultural.*

OR: QUESTION THREE

Examine the role of the gods in a classical literary text.

In your answer:

- Examine the ways in which a god(s) intervenes in the lives of the characters in your chosen text.
- Draw developed conclusions about the ways in which this intervention affects the relationship between gods and humans in the text.

OR: QUESTION FOUR

Examine threats to social and/or cultural traditions in a classical literary text.

In your answer:

- Examine how social and/or cultural traditions were undermined by a character(s) in your chosen text.
- Draw developed conclusions about how the failure to uphold these traditions leads to conflict in the text.
