KO TĒNEI RĀNEI: TE PĀTAI TUARUA

He rite tonu tā ngā ringa toi o uki whakarākei i ngā āhuatanga o ā rātou mahi toi kia mau ai te aronga o te kaimātaki.*

Matapakina tēnei kōrero i te horopaki o tētahi, o ētahi mahi toi o uki rānei i whakaingoatia.

- tātarihia, homai hoki he tauira hāngai, ngā ara i whāia hei whakarākei i tētahi mahi toi, i ētahi mahi toi rānei.
- whakaputahia he whakataunga kua whakahiatohia mō te whānuitanga o te pikinga o te rerehua ā-whatu, ā-kare-ā-roto hoki rānei o te /ngā mahi toi i puta i ēnei whakarākeitanga.

EITHER: QUESTION ONE

One of the purposes of a figurative composition can be to convey a story.*

Discuss this statement with reference to one or more named classical art works.

In your answer:

- analyse one or more figurative compositions that convey a story
- draw developed conclusions about the ways in which the features and effects of the figurative composition are designed to enhance the message of the narrative.

** A figurative composition is an art work representing forms that are recognisably derived from real life and/or myth.*

OR: QUESTION TWO

Classical artists often enhanced the appearance of their art works to attract the interest of the viewer.*

Discuss this statement with reference to one or more named classical art works.

In your answer:

- analyse, with specific examples, the ways one or more art works were enhanced
- draw developed conclusions about the extent to which these enhancements added to the visual and/or emotional appeal of the art work(s).

** Enhancements may include, but are not limited to, additional structural components, decorative features, and the use of signs or symbols.*

KO TĒNEI RĀNEI: TE PĀTAI TUATORU

- whakaputahia he whakataunga kua whakahiatohia mō te hiranga o ngā uara i whakaatahia ai i te/ ngā mahi toi ki te hāpori i puta ai taua mahi toi.

** E hāngai ana ngā uara ki te tuakiri, ki ngā tūranga, ki ngā whakapono hāhi, ki ngā mahi pāpori hoki.*

KO TĒNEI RĀNEI: TE PĀTAI TUAWHĀ

I whanake ngā tūmomo mahi toi hōu me ngā tūmomo hoahoatanga hōu i te ao o uki i roto i te wā.

Matapakina tēnei kōrero i te horopaki o tētahi, o ētahi mahi toi o uki rānei i whakaingoatia.*

I tō whakautu:

- tātarihia ngā rerekētanga ā-āhua, ā-tikanga hoki rānei[†] i kitea i ngā mahi toi, i roto i te wā.
- whakaputahia he whakataunga kua whakahiatohia mō te whānuitanga o te whakapae, kua pai ake te āhua o te mahi toi taketake i ngā rerekētanga ā-āhua, ā-tikanga hoki rānei.

** Ko ngā mahi toi e hāngai ana ki ngā toi me ngā hoahoatanga.*

† Kei roto i ngā rerekētanga ā-āhua, ā-tikanga rānei, ngā tikanga whakaputa, ngā āhuatanga o te hanga, ngā rauemi i whakamahia, te hoahoa, me te hanganga hoki, engari ehara i te mea ko ēnei anake ōna āhuatanga.

OR: QUESTION THREE

Art works can reflect the values of the society in which they were produced.*

Discuss this statement with reference to one or more named classical art works.

In your answer:

- analyse the ways in which one or more art works were designed to convey values
- draw developed conclusions about the significance of the values conveyed in the art work(s) to the society in which it was produced.

* *Values may relate to identity, roles, religious beliefs, and social activities.*

OR: QUESTION FOUR

New styles of art and architecture developed over time in the classical world.

Discuss this statement with reference to one or more named classical art works.*

In your answer:

- analyse one or more of the stylistic and/or technical changes[†] that occurred in art works over time
- draw developed conclusions about the extent to which the new stylistic and/or technical changes could be considered an improvement to the original style of art work(s).

* *Art works refers to art and / or architecture.*

† *Stylistic and / or technical changes may include, but are not limited to, methods of production, features of construction, materials used, design, and composition.*
