

The Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) is a United Nations agency mandated to protect and support refugees, at the request of a government or the UN itself, and assists in their voluntary repatriation, local integration, or resettlement to a third country. There are more than 43 million uprooted people worldwide. UNHCR now deals with 33.9 million people of concern: 14.7 million internally displaced people, 10.5 million refugees, 3.1 million returnees, 3.5 million stateless people, more than 837,000 asylum-seekers, and more than 1.3 million other persons of concern. The budget has grown from US\$300,000 in its first year in 1951 to more than US\$3.59 billion in 2012.
