You will hear two music extracts. Each extract will be played as follows:

- First, the whole extract will be played ONCE, from beginning to end.
- Then, sections of the extract will be played as you complete specific tasks. Each section will be played THREE times.
- Finally, the whole extract will be played FOUR times, from beginning to end.

There will be a pause of 35 seconds after each playing.

EXTRACT ONE

You now have two minutes to read the information below.

You will hear an extract in the key of C major for voice, with ukelele and bass guitar accompaniment. The music is printed on page 3.

The whole extract will now be played ONCE. Follow the score as the music plays. A crotchet-beat pulse will be heard before the extract starts.

Separate sections of the extract will now be played, THREE times each.

(a) **Section A** (bars 1-9)

Add the missing chord indications to the score, using Roman numerals OR jazz/rock notation (as shown below).


(b) **Section B** (bars 10–18)

 - (ii) Identify the final cadence (the two chords bracketed in bars 25 and 26). Select from: perfect, plagal, imperfect, and interrupted.

(d) **Section A** (bars 1–16)

On the score, indicate:

- the name of the instrument you hear
- the tempo of the music, using an appropriate Italian or English word, or an appropriate metronome marking
- TWO dynamics, putting an appropriate marking in each box in bars 13 and 16
- TWO gradual changes in dynamic, using an appropriate musical term or sign.
- (e) **Section B** (bars 17–24)

Transcribe the missing melody notes, using the durations shown above the staff.

(f) **Section E** (bars 39–46)

On the score, indicate:

- changes in the tempo of the music, using appropriate Italian terms

- any change in the articulation of particular notes, using appropriate musical signs.
