TASK

This task has FOUR parts, (a) to (d). Use the information from the resource booklet and the boxes in this booklet, in addition to your business knowledge, to complete this task. You may integrate any relevant Māori business concepts into your answers.

(a)	(i)	Using Resource A, explain ONE possible negative effect for <i>Pristine Recycling</i> of the reduced amounts of plastic waste that it is receiving.
	(ii)	Explain the impact on the business or a stakeholder of the business.

As Resource B shows, the sorting part of the production process has had problems with an old machine breaking down increasingly often. The directors of *Pristine Recycling* have decided to invest in a new sorting machine to resolve this issue. They are investigating two models.

(b) (i) Using Resource C, explain ONE positive effect that choosing Model A would have on the business.

(ii) Explain ONE positive effect that choosing Model B would have on the business.

Pristine Recycling has also decided that it needs to solve the issue of the district councils having limited capacity to store plastic waste. As a result, it is introducing a change to the collection part of the production process, initially in Oslo. Here, the collection will not be carried out by district councils, but by a company that has large storage facilities. *Pristine Recycling* has two companies from which it can choose – one in Norway and the other in Finland. *Pristine Recycling* has central government permission for the chosen firm to collect plastic in each country. If the chosen company impresses *Pristine Recycling*, it will win the contract for collection in both Oslo and Helsinki.

(c) (i) Using Resource D, explain ONE benefit to *Pristine Recycling* of outsourcing the collection part of the production process to *Zen Recycling*.

(ii) Explain ONE benefit to *Pristine Recycling* of outsourcing the collection part of the production process to *Less Solutions*.

(d) (i) Using Resource E, explain the cause of the higher costs.

(ii) Explain the impact of the higher costs on the business or a stakeholder of the business.
