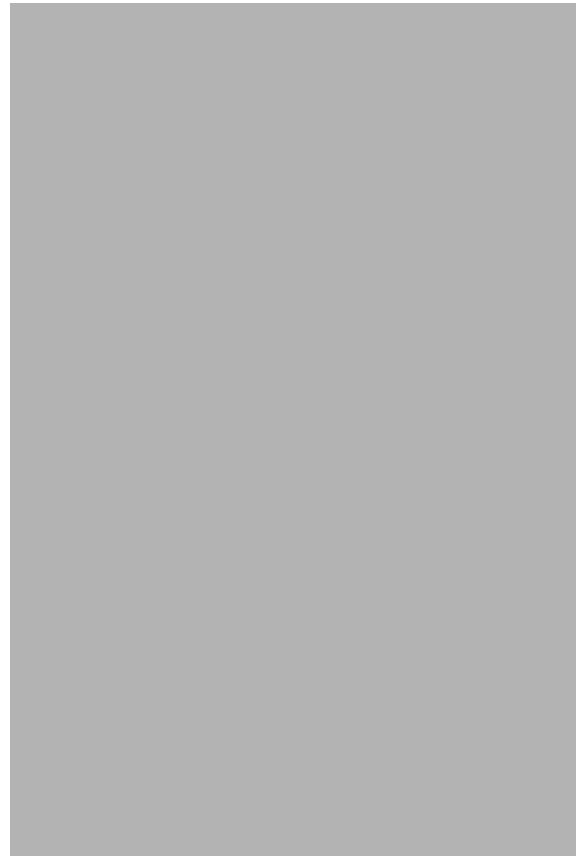

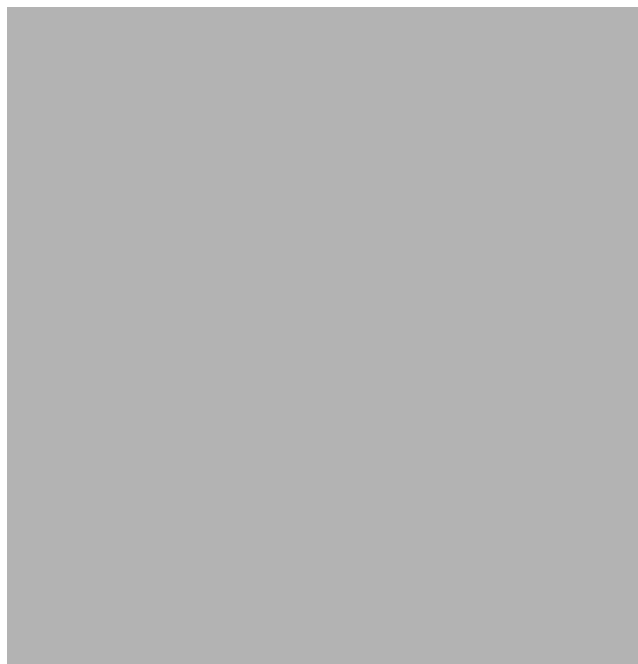

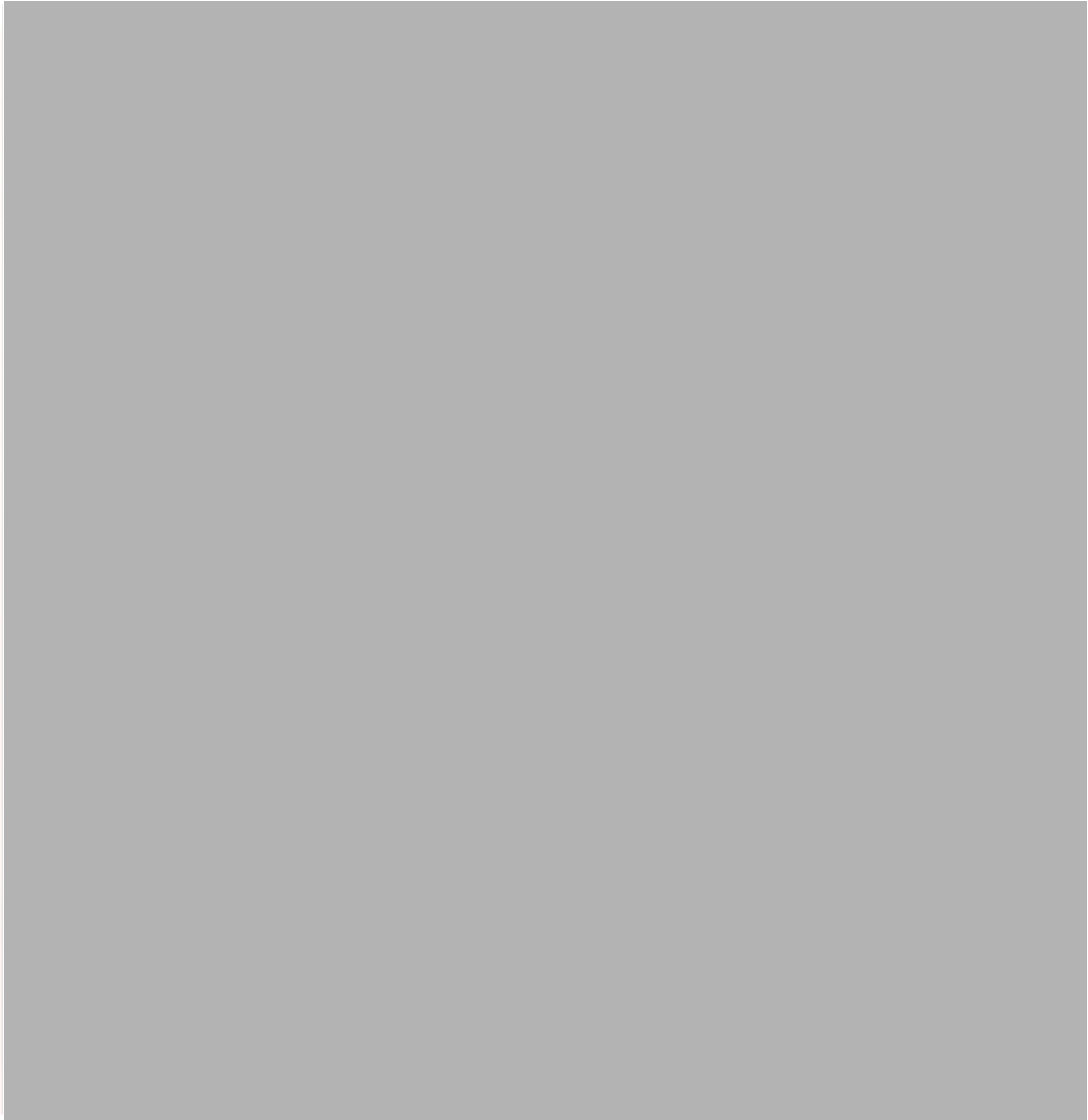

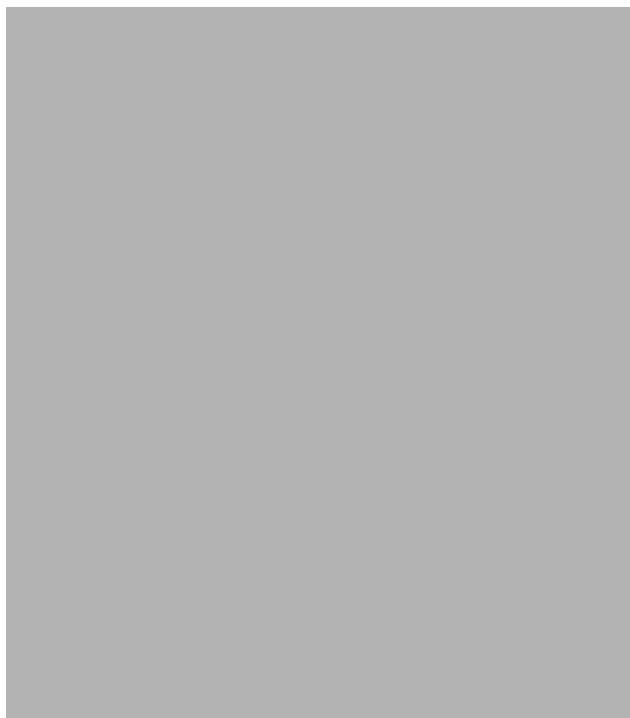
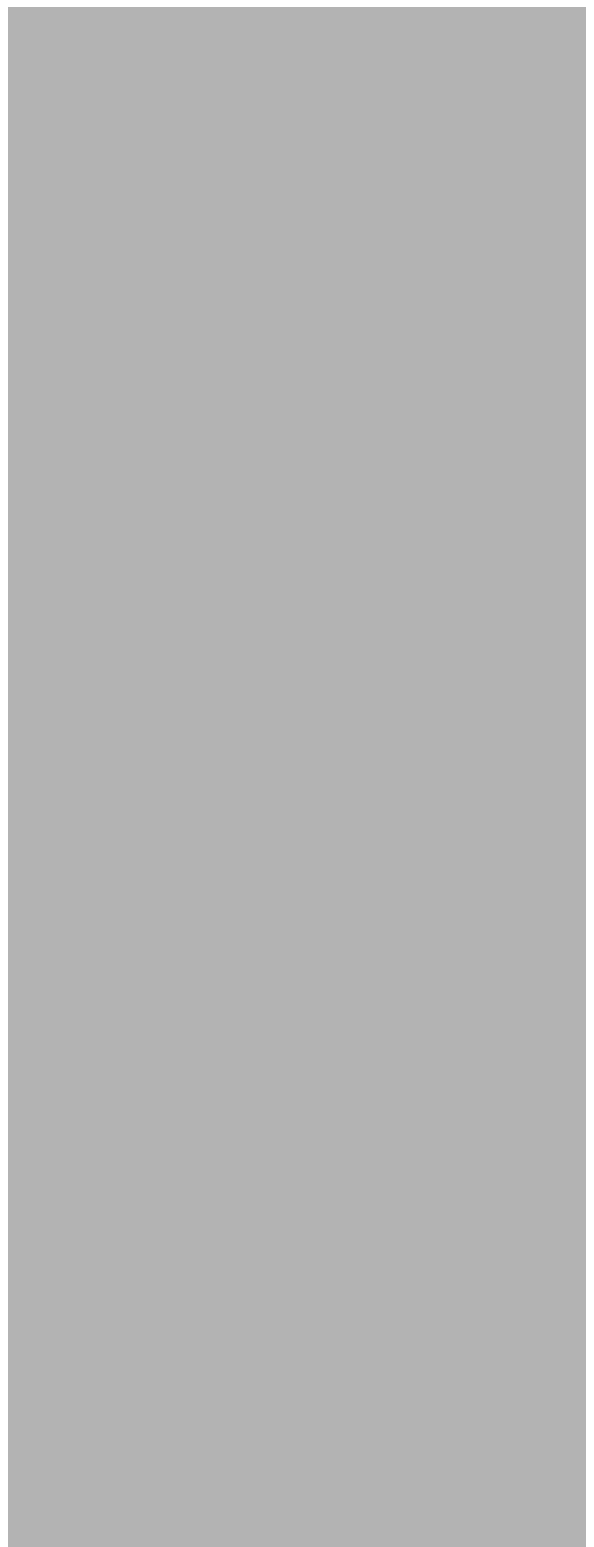

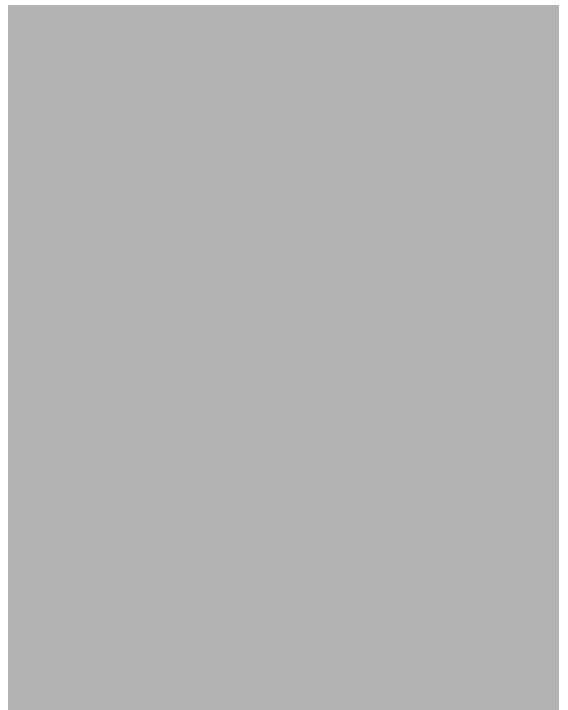

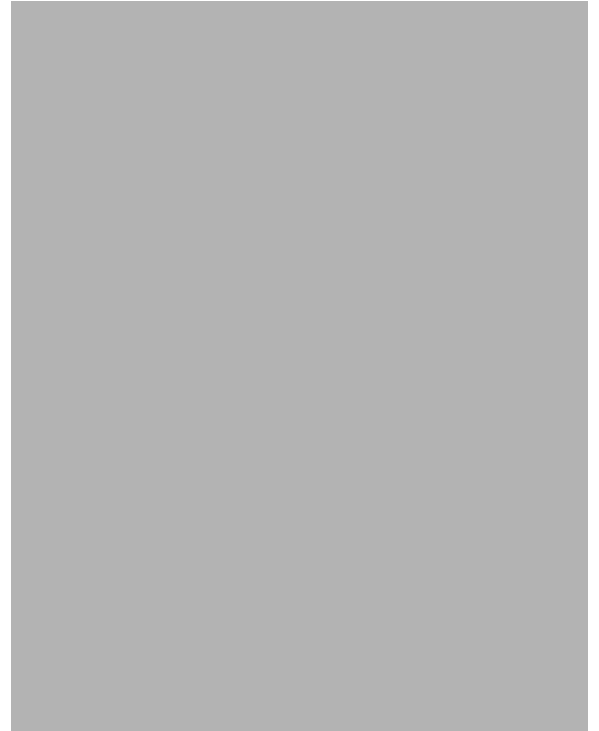

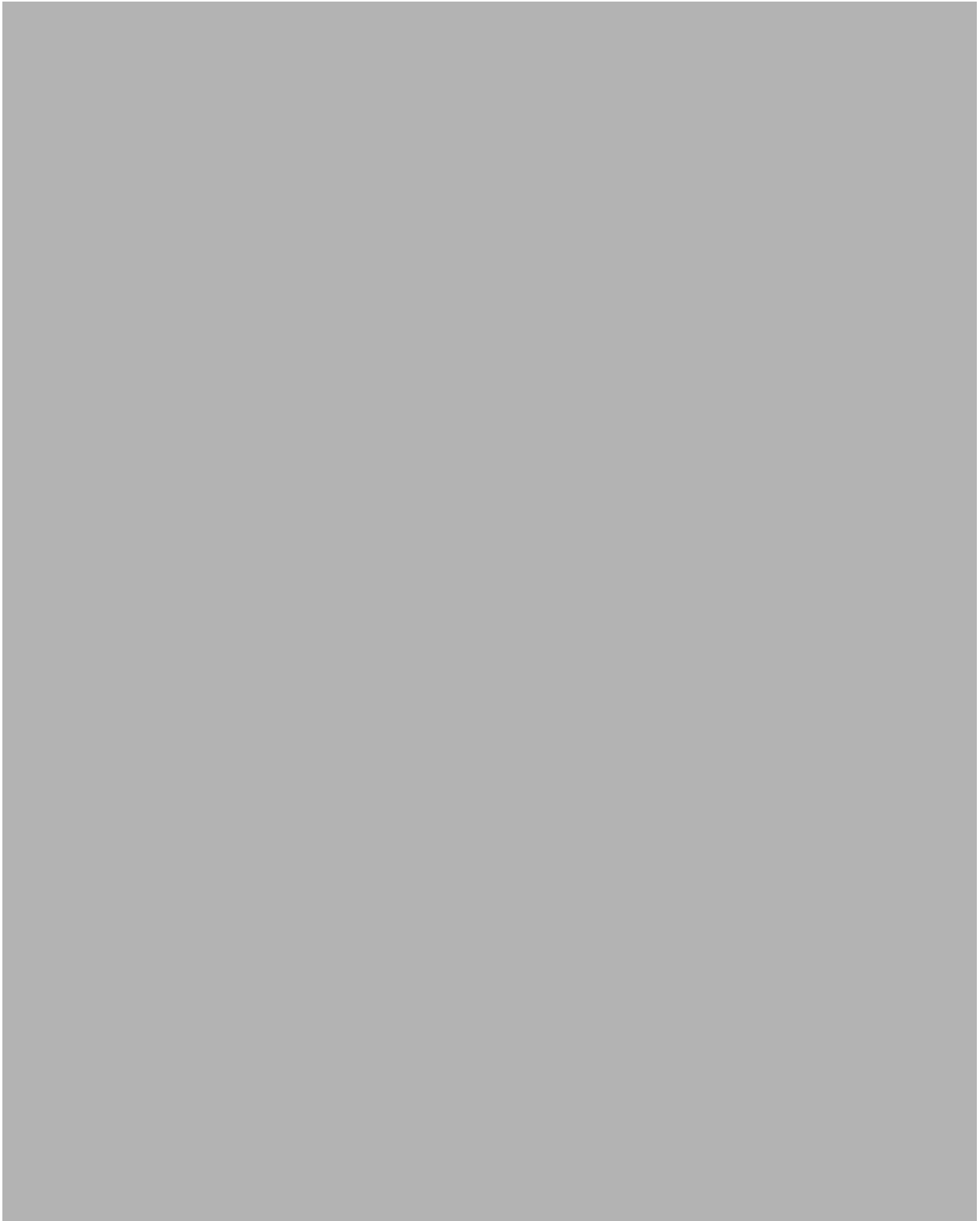

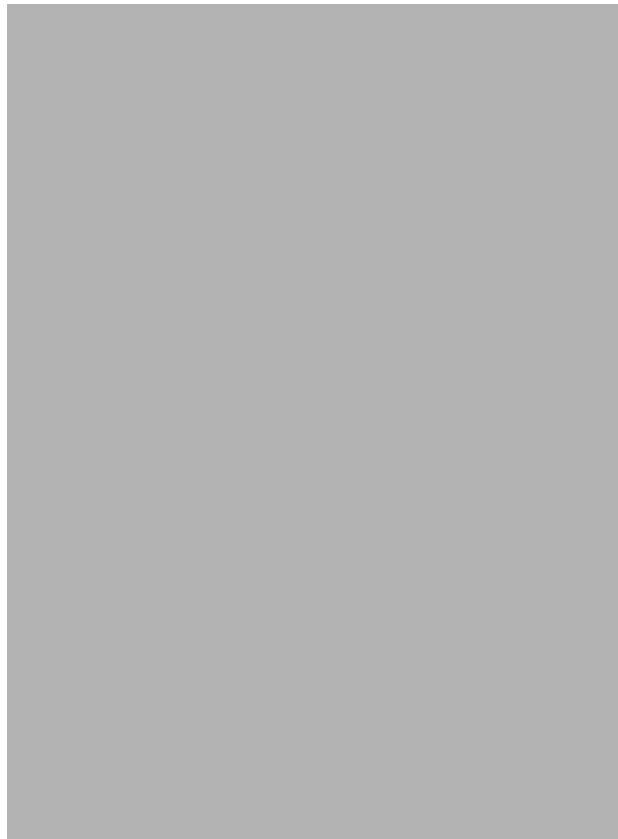
CONTEMPORARY DIVERSITY (after 2000)

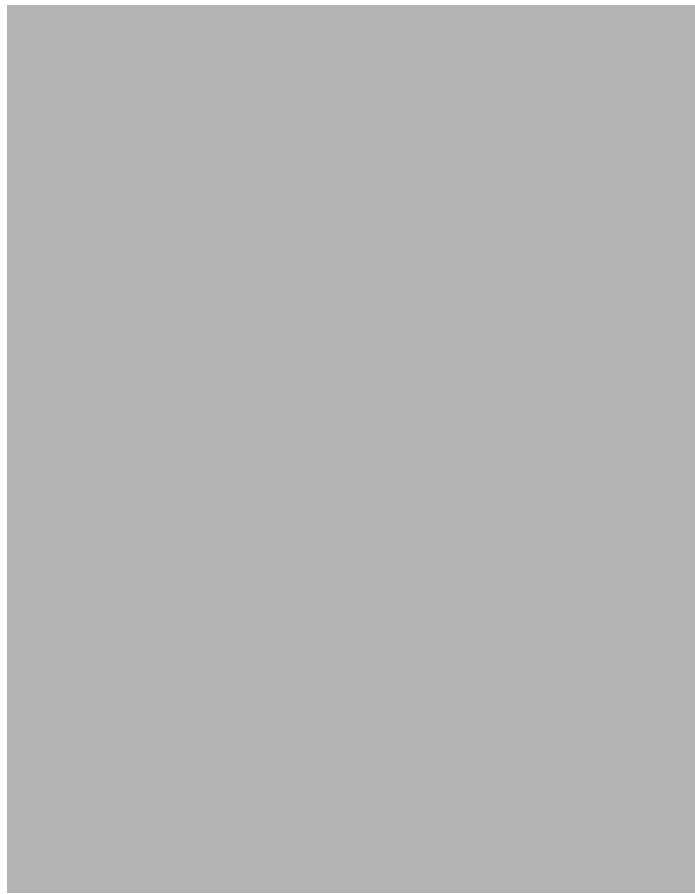
