Many Māori dance forms have a focus on the group.

Describe the importance of the group in a Māori dance form, and discuss how a group focus has contributed to the development and/or continuance of this Māori dance form. Refer to the above whakataukī/quote in your answer.

You might comment on:

- · technical and vocal skills
- tikanga (cultural protocols)
- kaupapa (philosophy and approaches)
- use of taonga/props.

OR: QUESTION THREE: Dance education in Aotearoa/New Zealand

Briefly describe the development of dance education in Aotearoa / New Zealand, and discuss how it has contributed to dance in New Zealand.

You might comment on:

- understanding and appreciation
- increase in audiences
- genre or style variety
- recognition of skills.

OR: QUESTION FOUR: Shona McCullagh

Discuss the innovation in Shona McCullagh's work, and the impact her work has had on dance in Aotearoa/New Zealand. Refer to at least one of the images below to support your answer.

You might comment on:

- use of technology
- · attitudes towards dance
- the development of a New Zealand style of contemporary dance.




