RESOURCE A**Average likeability ratings by species**

In a study on people's attitudes to animals and their use in research, participants showed more favourable attitudes towards pet species (e.g. dogs, rabbits, and cats) than pest species (e.g. rats, spiders, and wasps). They also tended to disagree with the use of pet species in research but were more neutral towards the use of pest species.
