TASK

This task has four parts, (a) to (d). Use the background information below, the supplementary information in the boxes on the following pages, and your business knowledge to complete this task. You may integrate any relevant Māori business concepts into your answers.

Background information

Kōwhai Grove is an orchard in the Bay of Plenty that grows organic avocados and citrus fruits. Recently, *Kōwhai Grove* introduced drone technology to monitor crop health and improve operational efficiency. The drones are equipped with advanced sensors that can detect signs of disease, water stress, and nutrient deficiencies, allowing the orchard to respond quickly to potential crop losses. By investing in drone technology, *Kōwhai Grove* is expecting to hire fewer seasonal workers this season.

To be considered an organic grower of avocados and citrus fruits in New Zealand, *Kōwhai Grove* needs to produce crops using certain biological growing practices and standards. As *Kōwhai Grove* produces organic crops, it can demand a premium price for its products in comparison to regular crops.

Kōwhai Grove prioritised protecting their neighbours' privacy while using drones for orchard management. Understanding that the drones' high-resolution images might sometimes include neighbouring properties, they took proactive steps to address this. They openly communicated with neighbours about the drone usage, clearly defined the areas being monitored, and ensured that any non-orchard images were promptly deleted. To achieve this, *Kōwhai Grove* invested in advanced equipment and software, allowing them to review and erase unintended data as soon as it was captured.

Using drones has helped *Kōwhai Grove* comply with various provisions of the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA) by allowing the orchard to monitor and manage environmental factors more efficiently. The drones can detect issues such as water stress or nutrient deficiencies in the fruit, enabling *Kōwhai Grove* to reduce water usage and make quick, informed decisions about the management of its resources.

Recently, the workers at *Kōwhai Grove* have become unsettled. Management have always offered fair wages, safe working conditions, and opportunities for personal and professional growth. However, the increasing use of technology has caused concern among the staff, who are worried that their jobs may be replaced.

Additionally, the business has hired a new payroll office administrator who has been making deductions from employees' pay for wet weather gear and footwear. The workers believe these costs should be covered by the business – not by them, as employees. The workers have collectively asked their union to meet with management to discuss these issues. However, negotiations have broken down, and the union is now considering industrial action.
