2	N2	Again the candidate demonstrated little understanding of the text and talked only about one main difference between old and new system. Section (b) candidate was unable to form an opinion on the new system.		
3	N2	Candidate demonstrated little understanding of the text. To gain A3 or A4 candidate needed to include more details, eg length of training in New Zealand, conditions to apply in Germany, etc.
