#### QUESTION ONE

(a) Why can't Anaru have his first choice?



Anaru can't have his first choice of Japanese style ramen because there are no ramen shops there because ramen is not a traditional Japanese food. Although there are definitely yummy Japanese restaraunts/shops that they can walk to and Anaru says that today is cold so ramen is probably good, his host sister Yuriko tells him that there no ramen shops there (as ramen is not a traditional Japanese food). Anaru is quite set on eating Japanese food rather than Western food (as seen when Yuriko asks him which he would prefer, Western food or Japanese food) and he is hungry so this is quite disappointing for him. 


