QUESTION ONE: 광고 (Advertisement)

Read Text A on page 2 of the resource booklet.

(a) Explain what the advertisement is promoting.

Option A: Option A is promoting a waterpark through the advertisement. It starts off by introducing that it is a very fun experience for all. They also let us know opening times are from 10 am to 10 pm, and their pricing is 8000 ^{won} for ^{an} average person/adult and 5000 ~~won~~ for a student. So, overall, they are promoting the amusement park and its attractions.

- (b) What types of tourists would these different options attract? Use evidence from the text to support your answer.

Option A would receive many tourists during the summer because it is a waterpark. They would receive a majority of young people because they are considered to like waterparks and their rides more, and because of the unique attraction inside the park, (the dog cafe) they would receive a lot of dog lovers. They may also attract a lot of foreign tourists because of the barbeque food option which is popular overseas. Also based on what they promote in the advert, they may attract lots of groups of friends rather than people coming alone.

Option B would attract a lot of couples. This is because of what they mention, that the amusement park is a very lovely place which is a common date spot for young couples. Similar to the water park I think the amusement park would attract younger people rather than old, because of things like daring rides, or things that could be considered childish like their parades. They may also attract a lot of foreigners tourists. This is because of their promotion of cursive characters displayed in their parade. Both Option A and B receive similar tourists like younger people ^{would} or ^{some} foreigners but also quite a few different ones like dog lovers and couples.
