



women had a significant impact on the evolution of Fosse Jazz, as strong and liberated movements became combined into the choreographic language of Fosse Jazz. For example in Mein Herr' Sally was the strong dominant female lead. Within the time of the post WWII era Broadway was undergoing some significant changes as well. The transformation of Musical theater, where movements became more characteristic and stylized led Fosse to re-think his perspective on movements and communicating a narrative through storytelling.
