'wasps' by Aristophanes is a classical play that discusses the political atmosphere of Athens alt that time. The play includes the main relationship between an addicted father philocleon, and a son named Bdelycleon. At the start of the play, Philocleons intense addiction and his crazy attitude after being locked in his house to stop his addiction caused the first challenge of the play; the attitude of the older generation. Bdelycleon and his servants reminiced how philocieon would return with "wax under his nails" every day from the acessive addiction he carried-His addiction was so extreme that he tried to escape out with a donkey in font of his son "19 never thought id see our old donkey discharge a jurymen" His extreme addiction acts as challenge for his and Baelycleons relationship as it discusses the two extremely different perspectives they curry: Bdelycleon does not understand

Why his father is so addicted to the court room and tries to figure out how to fix his situation because he is apart of the newer generation of Athens, a carefree one that does not enfoure the vigorous rules and cultural values that were enforced before. Philocleon on the other hand, is a part of the adder generation and because of his experience of the old athens and military increment, he does not feel needed in society. Ola Athenian customs believe that to be a part of Athenian society, you need to se a contributor. As Pnilocleon is a war veteran who cannot serve onywore, the only way he can be a part of society and contribute is through being a juror The money is also a great upside, but the real reason deep down is to feel wanted and appreciated in society like he once was before as a veteran. Aristophanes uses philocleon as a character to highlight the sad fate of all these war veterans who have nothing to do ringmore; from being the most popular protectors of Athens to nobody's to show the changes in society and now nobody is doing onything to correct this. Overall the differing opinions on Philodeon's addiction between his son and him highlight the different perspectives of the old and new generation in Athenian society as a challenge.

But, as the plan progresses we see philocleon understand the perspective of Bdelycleon as he discusses the comption in modern court. Bdelycleon starts off by disusing the corruption in
taxes that is evident; with "12 million drachmae" going in as taxes and only "six hundread thousand" alloted for the jurors, it keeps the jurous (or old veterans) (omingback for move. Arrtophores tries to explain the comption to his audience to help them understand what their leader Cleon is doing wrong. Bdelydeon then goes on to as his father "why dort you try your own household?" in the attempt to help him understand empathy for the convicted people who be Phibcleon bills for the money without a thought. This learning period is vital for Philocleon an an Bdelycleons relationship as it helps w understand the challenges not only in the play, but outer challenges such as court cormption and Athenion leaders not leading correctly. Aristophanes tries to always teach his audience or put a vital message about the society they lie in as it was crumbling at that point and Aristophanes wanted it to twine. Overall, philodeors development and understanding helps us understand the challenge between this family as the growth is imedietly crumbled the second then step foot into society. Hs important to show this growth as it allows the audience to see that ore side of the argument can se fixted, but not all of it idisplaying the challenge.

As Philucleon gets ready to go celebrate his growth with
his sun Bdelydeon, he is met with a new challenge; the younger generations perspective. The younger generation was not as strict as the older one, then had lost complete Athenian morality and passion because there w org washit any enforced social values that wertanght. The new generation wee influenced by people such as socrates who wold walle around talking rather than helping the city in any way. Athenian Supremacy had also taken a bullet as the youngsters were coming out in "Persian goon. Sportainshoos", Bdelycleon offered these to his father but his fathoner vetaliated "What in the gods name is this horrible thing!". He still wore it to the symposeum he didh's on ger his son. Drinking at symposiums was also a big no-noin athenian society in the olden days as real men stayed home and took care of their families, while drinking was not morally acceptable. This shift in societal values that Bolelucle on veprorats acts as a challenge in the father and sons relationship as the cleaned up phiocleon reverts to his old ways as he cannot handle the change in sucietry. This reflects aristophanes' purpose of creating this relationship to show the bad qualities of both there generations; the younger generation are not real men who carnot take care of Athens like the older geneation did-Alistophonies shows on imbaknce in society as the older is crazy 'I dons nave control over my own money" so the son has to Hence car of him while the new generation is doomed as they donn have the same a values us true old Athos which thrived.
overall, Bdelycleons generation acts as another challenge in the fate and sars relationship as it further explains the facts in society and what a big jump philocleon had to take to 'fit in'. His values differfrom his sons which creates challenges and reveals Aristophanes main purpose in writing this book; Discussing the coription in society and the down of athens.
