Four	M5	The response discusses in depth the relationship between Philocleon and Bdelycleon and why it is challenging.
		Paragraph 2 starts by identifying Philocleon as a veteran and the views of the older generations, which shows a good understanding of the ideas and values of the ancient Greeks of Aristophanes' time. The relationship of fixing Philocleon is shown in the next part of the paragraph as Bdelycleon is mentioned as the new generation – the son having differing views from his father. This paragraph has good ideas, but these are not conveyed well – Philocleon is shown as a sad veteran, which is not wrong, but is out of place after mentioning Bdelycleon.
		Paragraph 4 shows a good understanding of the younger generation and their values, e.g. wearing Persian and Spartan merchandise. There is a good analysis here of Aristophanes' messages, which pushes this response into the merit level rather than achieved.
		The conclusion refers to Aristophanes' messages regarding Cleon. The candidate demonstrates a strong understanding of historical context in this response and in the conclusion, but the text knowledge is not sufficiently strong for more than low Merit.
