Q	Grade score	Marker commentary	
One	A4	The candidate showed a basic understanding of Rose's situation and why she is upset. They showed that, with Teina's help, Rose was able to help find the house keys.	
Two	A4	The candidate showed some understanding of the text in their response by stating that Arona was going to cook due to Mama being unwell. They also stated that Arona was overjoyed due to Mama allowing him to buy lollies if there is left over money.	
Three	A3	The candidate showed some understanding of some parts of the text but was not specific to the text. For example, the statement "He was unhappy because there had been some cheats during the race" needed to specify who or what was cheating. For the candidate to achieve at Merit level, they needed to elaborate more on their stated points.
