

One	E8	The candidate provided a detailed recount of why Rose was upset and how she recovered her house keys with the assistance of Teina. The candidate's answers suggest they were deliberate in selecting the ideas and evidence they used.
Two	E8	The candidate provided a fully constructed response by selecting relevant ideas from the text. This enabled the candidate to solidify their answer about why Arona was needed to go to the shop for his Mama, and why he was happy.
Three	E7	The candidate showed a thorough understanding of the language in the answers provided. The candidate shared detailed extracts from the texts to solidify their answers, and showed understanding about Tangi and Toma's feelings and frustrations.
