Assessment Task

(a) Describe a social action you have undertaken this year and its aim in relation to a social issue.

For my group's social action we looked into recycling system and how we recycled the paper and cardboard at our school. It turned out that every classroom and office only had one bin that was used for general waste and that we didn't have recycling bins. My partner and I decided that we wanted to do something about this and we ended up contacting an organisation that provided free 30L recycling bins to any type of school. Doing this we hoped that we could improve the recycling system at our school and potentially our carbon footprint as well. Part of our social action was writing a proposal to our schools principal and property manager to approve our idea for our social action. We had to set up meetings with them to get their signatures and opinions of what could happen and how many we needed, etc. The organisation that we contacted was called . This was a problem as they weren't funded enough and was based in to provide bins to our school in . Then they sent an email saying that they had reached out to City Council and they had said that they would fund us for the classroom recycling bins. We kept in contact with both and City Council so we always knew what was happening and how things were going.

(b) Describe how the social action has challenged or supported your chosen system.

The social action that my partner and I chose is challenging the current paper and cardboard recycling system at **Social**. Creating the google form and writing up the proposal was appropriate as they helped to understand the opinions of a range of different years at our school. They helped us to decide where to put the bins, things they might want us to look at and if they would actually use the recycling bins or not.

Meeting with from City Council was also very appropriate and she explained everything about how partnering with them would work and how we should collect future data of how much we are recycling. Also figuring out where we would put the bins so they'd get used or how we would ensure that the bins would be being used and not getting damaged or lost. We also spoke to about the possible short-term and long term impacts that getting the paper and cardboard recycling bins might have.

(d) Evaluate the short-term and potential long-term impact(s) of your social action in challenging or supporting your chosen system.

The short-term impacts of our social action would be that would be improving their environmental footprint and also limiting the amount of waste that would be going into the landfills. This would be because the recycling bins from would be separating the paper and cardboard from our general waste so it can get taken away and reused and recycled.
