Read Text A on page 2 of the resource booklet.

(a) What has gone wrong with each friendship?

One	M5	<p>The candidate has shown a clear understanding of Jakob's and Alexa's friendships, but the answers are lacking in detail. There is no mention of the jealousy that Alexa's best friend feels towards her new relationship with Paul.</p> <p>However, the answer given about Lily is incorrect and stops the candidate getting a M6 – it is Lily who breaks contact with her best friend not the friend making friends with another girl</p>
Two	M5	<p>The candidate shows a clear understanding of the texts about micro adventures, but there are no higher-level ideas and only one adventure is talked about in Part B.</p>
Three	M5	<p>In part (a) the candidate demonstrates good understanding of Linus and his views with minor omissions. In Part B, Anna's views on personality being more important to her and having nothing to do with appearance or beauty are included. The answer for Part C requires more accuracy – Miro's classmates wear similar clothes to each other, they don't have a similar view to Miro on fashion.</p>
