



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(iv) Describe a pattern seen in Figure 9 (page 9 of the resource booklet), the graph showing the percentage of children living in low-income families.



A4	In part (a), the précis map contains some errors in size and shape, particularly regarding Westfield Stratford City, Victoria Park, and the path of the A12 road. While key features are described, they are not explicitly identified as natural or cultural. In part (b), changes are recognised, but the explanations lack detail, and while patterns are described, they include only some specific evidence. In part (c), the concept of change is acknowledged, but the discussion of sustainability is underdeveloped and lacks specific evidence.
