



  - (iii) Key features of Stratford, London

Using specific information, describe the key natural and cultural features of Stratford and the surrounding area that made it a suitable location for the development of the Olympic village.

Stratyord, located North East of greater London, includes many notival geatures including approximately 7 parks along with river Leen being spread and across the area. This makes stratifierd an appealing environment to durists and the Olympics along with the cultural gradures such as the railway, nearby Homendon University hospital, London Stadium, and Condon agrodics centre. Being diese hath natural and cultural geodores oren't too clustered together, makes it suitable location to develop the Olympic village which can also benegit the economic environment of nearby bisinesses. Much of the industrial geodores can be used for the olympic village to support Stayers and computitors.

(ii) Which of the changes identified in part (i) was most significant for Stratford?

The most significant change identified in Stratgard was the economic change due to the despirate need for regeneration to an area that had been deindustrialised.

(iii) Explain the reasons for your choice in part (ii).

Prior to the 2012 Olymipics in Stradyord, She area was declining when the city deirdustrialised. This meant in the 1980's unanployment rates were high and children were underperforming in school as not enough money was being put towards jobs and education. The development of the Olympic village in Stradyord enabled 46,000 New jobs, 20,000 new homes, along with more money towards education and health care. The positive change of the economic environment was careful to be enable the area to positively develop and gain more population fluringue continuity to support economic benefits. Beause of the Olympics, East London welcomed more new bistnesses than anywhere else in the city.


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#### (c) Sustainability in the urban environment
