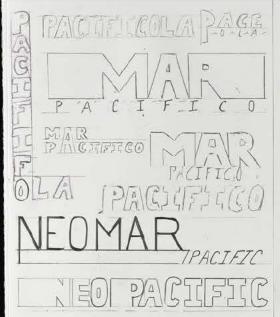

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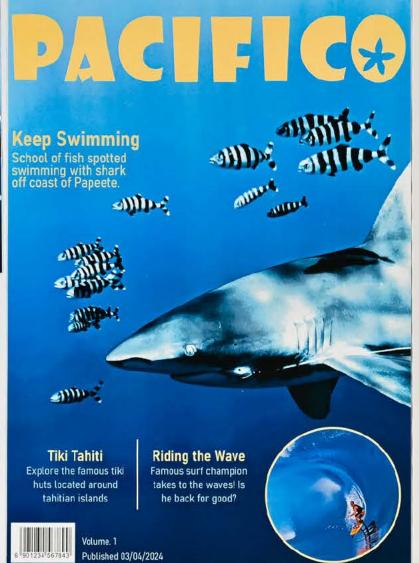

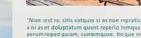

Marker commentary

This portfolio was verified and placed in the upper end of the Achievement grade range as it clearly fulfilled the criteria by:

- using appropriate design techniques and media that suits the intended purpose
- exploring a range of design briefs to reformat image and type, and systematically generate ideas: website design brief, magazine spread, poster, type, and fit for the target audience
- laying out works in a grid, which aids the reading of the work, and presenting the thinking at each stage
- using typography in a consistent manner
- building upon previous work and showing some purposeful decision-making
- reusing the same imagery. This limits the candidate's ability to extend ideas and move work forward.

To be awarded Merit, the portfolio would need more evidence of:

- sustained investigation in the use of text
- the use of other established practice to inform new ideas and decisions
- a broader range of imagery
- a wider range of subject-matter options, particularly at the beginning of Panel 2
- bolder magazine concepts and developments, rather than incremental shifts in layouts
- greater understanding of typography and how to apply text and image across briefs.
