Marker commentary

This portfolio was verified and placed in the lower end of the Excellence grade range as it clearly fulfilled the criteria by:

- including a visually rich generation of imagery on the top of Panel 1: this allows for a wide proposition and foundation of ideas to build from; a great selection and framework to build upon; and a wide range of visual and textual assets
- using hand-drawn elements to explore text, image, line, and colour, and they combine text, image, layout, and texture
- showing in-depth understanding of the design conventions used, evidenced in the combining of text and image compositions.
- presenting best options from each brief; editing, selection, and ordering of work is consistent
- demonstrating fluent understanding of how to apply text and image in design work
- providing a 3-dimensional element to the final booklet, which elevates the functional context and purpose of the page layout and design; the candidate was rewarded for their thought process in how the outcome functions, along with its aesthetic, physical properties (not just a digital mock up).

To sit more securely in the Excellence range, the portfolio would need more evidence of:

- a critical understanding on how to advance ideas in new diverse directions, e.g. the page layout of the zine and how the individual pages connect with each other
- identifying strengths in markmaking, pattern, and typography; these could have been used to regenerate ideas further.
