This portfolio was verified and placed in the lower end of the Merit grade range as it clearly fulfilled the criteria by:

- purposefully selecting sculptural, art-making conventions to frame the ideas, this portfolio includes the use of scale-shift, alternate materials, and found objects, which are clearly related to a conceptual purpose
- presenting a body of work that shows a generation, development, and extension of ideas, with the use of wooden spoons to show a range of measurements used in the context of cooking extending ideas in relation to the reading of sculptural materials
- competently using appropriate media and techniques to advance ideas within the artmaking process.

To sit more securely in the Merit range, the portfolio would need more evidence of:

• the extension of ideas; the relatively small number of works on the portfolio limited the opportunity to further advance the development of ideas.



This portfolio was verified and placed in the upper end of the Merit grade range as it clearly fulfilled the criteria by:

- making decisions that are clearly related to the establishment of a pictorial and conceptual purpose; repeated imagery, related to the eye of 'Big Brother', is established early in the submission, and is explored through a range of appropriate sculptural conventions, e.g. model-making, card construction, and the use of light as a sculptural medium
- demonstrating an understanding of hierarchy to identify final works and strongest images in the purposeful exploration of the subject matter
- identifying and competently using appropriate media and techniques to frame the investigation and advance the ideas.

To be awarded Excellence, the portfolio would need more evidence of:

• the clarification and regeneration of ideas to identify best options and a more fluent use of media and techniques.
