Two	A4	This response shows a good understanding of the plot of Antigone. The approach to the response is a little more than a plot recount, there is good use of correct quotes, and paraphrasing shows understanding. The question is continually referred to and a clear use of paragraph structure supports focus. However, there is no reference to any wider context of what was happening in Athens at the time of the text. There is minimal reference to the role of women, or the importance of burial in the Ancient Greek world within the response, which would have enabled the response to attain a higher grade.
