The Marjory Stoneman Douglas Shooting occurred on the 22nd of February 2018 where 17 were killed, 14 students and 3 staffs. The gun that was used by the murderer who was a n ex student of Marjory Stoneman Douglas high school was an AR-15. Days after, the survivors along Cameron Kasky who is also one of the survivors started up the Never Again MSD campaign to advocate for stronger gun control laws and to ban military style assault weapons.

Cameron Kasky who was the founder of Never Again MSD believes that there should be changes to the gun control laws to stop the mass shootings happening. Cameron values the right people to live and be free and should not be worried and scared for their lives. He believes if the changes to the gun control laws are being looked at and will be changed then high schools should not feel scared or worried that there wont be any mass shootings in their schools. Cameron Kasky ideological perspective is shaped by his Liberal ideological perspective. He wants a change to the gun control laws because he feels that there should be a change in the system/law for students to feel safe in their own school environment and won't have to be worry.

Wayne La-Pierre who is the Vice Executive President of the National Rifle Association in 2018 believed that changes made to the gun control laws will take away his right and individuals rights to own a gun because he values the 2nd Amendment of the American citizens 'right to bear arms' Wayne La-Pierre's ideological perspective is shaped by his Conservative Ideological perspective. He feels that making changes will just take the rights of individuals to own a gun and that will just open up door to more mass shootings.

The impact of these two responses really took a hit which in Cameron Kasky along with the other survivors of the Marjory stoneman Douglas shooting planned a protest which was March for our lives on March 14th which had somewhere about 800,000 protests turn up and the march started from the capitol (Washington dc) and ended up at Pennsylvania Ave. The march had the speeches and rallies where Emma Gonzalez also did a speech in front of the 800,000 crowd to talk about what she went through and how she wants to advocate fir a more stronger gun control laws and to ban military style assault weapons. They had powerful speeches addressing the 17 deaths and strong words to get peoples attention! The NRA was really strategic of when Wayne La-Pierre would do his speech and because everyone was waiting for their address but ended up making their address to the public 1 week after the shooting happened. They knew not to do it early or straight after because they wanted peoples attention because if they did it early or straight after the shooting then there public appearance won't matter to people.

The 2 main feature of Indoctrination that both party used is Fear based messaging and using the media. For the NRA, they used the media to make their public appearance and using it to advertise their message which the NRA also spoke at CPAC. The Never Again MSD used the media and also news broadcasters well known in America but also was in the Vogue/Time Zone magazine which is very well known to the public and really famous in America. Never Again MSD as there way to get to whole public used news broadcasts like the ABC, NCB and NBBC. Fear based messaging was also used as a little threat to the public saying if you do this then this is what will happen. It was just way for the NRA to get supporters.
