The first common ideology evident in this social issue includes Humanitarianism. This ideology is represents the idea that all Human beings describe to be treated with respect and dignity. And firmanitarians believe in improving peoples lives by focusing on the needs of the person affected by conflict and avoiding the approach to deal further reduce softering. Through social processes such as legaslative and political reform as well as evaving community practites. One example of how Humanitarianism the social process of legaslative and political reform has effected the response to managing youth crime is serescribe invenity. The minister for children, Koven Charchhour believes that this approach for 2024 yourn offenders will be proven very affective as a relult to app managing youth crime in NZ. She believes this because one claims a previous programme run between 2010-2016 achieved success in using similar tactics like this 2024 programme dans on using. However she claims they were short-term successes because it 'came instick' once oftenders veturned to their usual circle of friends. She stated 'SO we're concentrating on that also, we can't just put this programme together, put them through the programme, and then leave them on

their own afterwards.... We have to try something new. We can't just give up on these young people. Chhar & thinks this way because since she is the Minister for children, her beliefs are shaped by ner line of work and which further proves her desire to help young children live a better life. She is determined and committed to helping serious young offenders turn their lives around as they "do have to work with multiple organisations and ministries to make sure were stepping up in each area that young person needs help in. Minister of Children, Kuren Chhart beliefs and values are snaped by Humanitanianism are to her determination to assist young offenders in improving their liver and addressing the needs of the offenders in order to reduce suffering and chaos. The soid legaslative process of det dealing with this young offenders and gotth crime in New Zealand effects youth crime as it serves as a more legal, approve military-style approach and serves as an experience to help to the betterment of young offenders to reduce the risk of re-offending and Must reducing the rate of yourn crime rates or years continue.

De to Maori youth being the highest entitie group in committing offences over the past decade (sairce A) throughout the years it is evidently clear that as New Zealands indegipous ethnic group, programmer like Ma Te Huruhuru can be effective through focusing on young majori offenders help reconnect them to their cultural identity and in turn help turn these young offenders lives around. Mā Te Huruhuru's founder Mahera Maihi believes that a cultural approach to managing upith crime can be has been proven highly effective as "What we've noticed is if we can remove uping people out of their home environments with their blessing and their whanaus blessing and move them into papakainga, we've got some time there to really get into hearing and .. reconnect them took to and get them back to their identity." She Majhi believes that throwing youth in so prison isn't the answer and those punitive se responses or punishment... Just

generates more nate and along with war stating that it's not the way. What we really need to do is focus on, in my experience, cultural responsizeness! Which is why Mainis ma te Hurchen programme souses more on building trusting relationships since many offenders come from generations of "harm and cyclical domage". This social process of evolving communities and building better ractionships within these communities help effect the response to dealing with crime as it is all done to help ensure the betterment of and improvement of young maoni Offenders especially. Through programmes like these, it belos allows me individual to reconnect and turn with their cultural identity und in turn shapes them into a better to individual as programmes like Mā Te Hurunuru values strengthening the individuals mana and the rae Maoritanga plays in their beliefs that individuals Another programmels that has woven Māovitunga into their approach on managing youth crime includes the le Pae Oranga marae-bowed Justice programmes. These programmes give police an alternative approuch to court with rettering offenders to marge's where purels of the offenders peers sit in both I suggement and suppositive. This is a move restorative approach to handling youth crime and demonstrates regardative and political reform, as well as evaving cultural practises and changes in cultural and polinical and benguoval norms. Official police data demonstrates

that approximately 17,405 Te Pae Oranged referrals were made between 2017 and April 2023 and in the Waillato, since 2018, more than 500 referrals were made to Hamilton panels alone. Independent research backs up the exfectiveness of this approach to managing clime as they it's been found that ini panels are an effective alternative Justice resolution as the restorative approach causes a 22.25 per cent fet reduction in harm.
