QUESTION ONE

QUESTION TWO

(a) What adjustments has Lea had to make in living with her host family in Korea?



Lea has had to make slight adjustments living with her host family in Korea. One of them is that she now has to eat breakfast with her older homestay sister in the morning from Monday to Friday. This is new for lea as she used to wake up late in New Zealand and didn't have breakfast. She now has to wake up at 6:20 am to eat rice, soup, kimchi, and various side dishes. This is probably different from the food she ate when she was at New Zealand and she expresses that she finds eating various side dishes to be fun/interesting so it isn't a difficult adjustment for her. She also mentions that the homestay in Korea is an apartment that is on the 19th floor and she mentions that she is scared which means that she probably does not live in an apartment, at least one that is high, so she needs to adjust and get used to the height. In Korea, at school, you have to take off your shoes and wear slippers instead which is not something you do in New Zealand so this is another adjustment that Lea has had to make.

(b) Explain what kind of relationship Lea has with her host sister.

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Lea seems to have a good relationship with her older homestay sister. This is because she eats breakfast in the morning with her every day apart from Saturday and Sunday. Lea also goes to the school that is across the road with her on weekdays at 7:00 am. This suggests she has a good relationship with her host sister because if they had a bad relationship, they would be able to go to walk to school at different time since they live so close. Lea's host sister also gifted Lea a pair of comfortable and pretty black slippers which is nice of her and further suggests that they have a good relationship. Lea also returned the favour by gifting her host sister an All Blacks T-shirt in black which is the host sister's favourite colour. The fact that she knows her favourite colour could be an indication that they are close and have talked to each other a lot. However, it cannot be said that they are very very close.
