One	A4	The response was generalised, offering some details from the text to support the conclusions, such as the specific activities the characters do and do not have in common. The responses summarised information understood from the text rather than stating explicit details, for example "Heremoana and Amiria are helpful people who enjoy cooking for their families."	
Two	A4	The response to Q2(a) demonstrated clear understanding of the context and purpose of the text. Few explicit details were presented in Q2(b), for example "staying in bed in the morning during the holidays and church being a regular part of the weekly routine." Other parts were more generalised without explicitly stating the surrounding details. Furthermore, some details were misinterpreted, for example "going on walks with his mum rather than going to the market with his mum," or completely omitted, such as the types of food purchased. The response to Q2(c) addressed both parts of the question.	
Three	А3	The response demonstrated basic understanding of the text, with very general statements not containing finer details. For example, the directions to the café were omitted. The candidate relied on the use of emojis in the text to demonstrate understanding of the changing emotions in the final part of the question.
