- (a) *'Akamārama mai i te 'inangaro tautai o Okitini i roto i tōna ora'anga. 'I 'akapē'ea te tua i te 'akaāri mai 'anga i tēia?*

Explain Okitini's passion for fishing throughout his life. How is this shown in the text?

Q	Grade score	Marker commentary
One	M5	The response shows clear understanding of the text, identifying Okitini's early interest in fishing and his dream of supporting his family. It describes his different fishing methods and how his passion becomes reality. Ideas are sometimes listed, but overall, the response shows relevant understanding supported by evidence.
Two	M6	The response shows good understanding of the conversations between Rutia and Matina and between Rutia and Roi. It explains how Matina encourages kindness and generosity, while Roi recognises Rutia's skill and believes he has little chance of winning. The response shows understanding of how Rutia's past actions shape others' views.
Three	M5	The response shows understanding of Pae's blog, identifying who he is and the significance of the family photoshoot before leaving for overseas. It connects the weather to Pae's reflections and recognises his appreciation of his family. Greater clarity and explicit detail would strengthen the response.
