QUESTION ONE: *Un foro para los problemas* (A forum for problems)

Read Text A on page 2 of the resource booklet.

(a) What are Marita's problems?

B I U

Marita is nervous everyday when she goes to school because she studies a lkit oof subjects and her teachers give her a lot of homework. It is very hard for her to relax at home because she is very busy and has a lor of stress. Her parents ask her everynight "did you finish your homework?" or "did you eat fruit today?" She doesn't like that, she hates fruit because it is not tasty. She always needs to go to bed at midnight and she gets up at 5:30. She's sad because she never has time to see her friends or to have hobbies, like going to the beach or playing basketball.

(b) Describe the advice Abuelita has given.

B I U

Abuelita says that in life iit is very important to to do well the school's homework but it is also important to have a social life. If Marita thinks that the work at her school is very hard she must talk to her parents and look for a tutor or tlak to her teachers, since they can help with her studies and to create a plan too. Plus, it is important to go to bed before 10 pm because everyone needs to sleep enough, normally between 7 and 8 hours per night.
Marita has to remember to have breakfast to concentrate well during the day. If she is then hiungry it is important not to eat unhelathy/bad food, like a lot of cookies, chocolate, cakes, chips, ice cream or soft drinks. It is better to eat more healthy foods like fruits and veggies (banana, apple, or salad), a ham and cheese sandwich, eggs, fish or meat. For thirst it is better to drink a big bottle of water per day or a little bit of juice instead of a lot of coffee.
After doing the school work, she cna herself a price, for example, go see her friends, or watch a movie at the cinema. Some people love relazing at the beach and swimming in the ocean when the weather is nice or listenign to happy songs. These activities help her to have less stress in her life. If she's sleepy she cna do some exercise like going to the gym, go for a walk or dance with friends.

(c) Which pieces of advice do you think Marita would find the most difficult AND the easiest to follow?

- (a) List three of David's positive experiences from the day of the concert. Use details from the text to support your answer.

Positive experience (1):

B *I* U

- (b) List three of David's negative experiences from the day of the concert. Use details from the text to support your answer.

Negative experience (1):

Q	Grade score	Marker commentary
One	M5	The candidate understood the text well and made connections using supporting details, especially in parts (a) and (b). However, they did not include enough details or justification in part (c) to reach an Excellence grade.
Two	M6	The response shows a very good understanding of the text, and they have selected very accurate evidence to support their answer. They have got most of the detail but to get Excellence they needed to justify more fully their reasoning for choosing <i>la casa de vacaciones</i> (for example, why the other places were not chosen). They could have included some implied meaning or inferences which would have strengthened their response.
Three	M5	The candidate has understood the text well and has most of the details but did not really justify why David was proud of his culture, which brought down the grade. If the candidate had answered part (c) in more detail, the grade would have been higher.
