
The need or opportunity being met:

My website provides healthy, nutritional recipes to create meals using local ingredients and traditional practices.


The potential users and their requirements:

This website would be helpful to Māori people trying to reconnect with their heritage, locals seeing how they can use the ingredients they have around them and tourists looking to try new dishes.

An explanation of how you used or applied Manaaki Tanga or kaitiakitanga in their design or during the design stage / phase:

Choosing to base my recipes on traditional recipes keeps culture alive and spread awareness of our history connecting people to their heritage. Using local ingredients makes the dishes more accessible and supports local businesses and New Zealand's economy.

The use of feedback to improve their design:

I was told a natural colour scheme of neutral and greens would be suitable for my outcome.

Green by colour association represents healthy, fresh and natural often used in pseudoscience to trick people into thinking their products are healthy and all natural, making it suitable for my website of recipes that take fresh ingredients and turn them into healthy

meals.

How the design decisions you made improved the quality of your completed design for a proposed digital technologies outcome:

Having visual representation of my product helps users to see what their investing their time into. A calm colour scheme appeals to many users as opposed to a bright ill-fitting scheme. Having my text boxes rounded gives a friendly feeling and appeals to that feeling of "Your traditional grandmas recipe".

How the decisions made during the design stage / phase contributed to the design's fitness for purpose:

Having a readable font, neutral colour scheme, and visual representation of the food makes the website easy on the eyes. Aswell as the home page pictures and blurbs of each food linking to their corresponding page there is a clear navigation header at the top of the page making each page readily accessible. Having a clear separation between the ingredients and method makes the website easier to read and find your next step.

A3	<p>The candidate has met the Achievement criteria by presenting a design for a proposed digital technologies outcome – a recipe website. They described a need/opportunity, and identified potential users and their requirements. The candidate has provided design ideas through hand-drawn layout sketches, and included a completed final design in the form of mock-ups, showing how the proposed site would look and be structured. The written justification links aspects of the final design back to what the website needs to do, which provides some evidence of requirements being considered. The candidate includes discussion of manaakitanga/kaitiakitanga in relation to the design by describing how the website supports cultural connection and the use of local ingredients.</p> <p>To attain Merit, feedback and refinement would need to have been clearly shown. While feedback was mentioned, the candidate did not show what changed between the ideas and the final design. Design decisions were mostly descriptive and were not explained in terms of how they improved design quality.</p>
