Last month, Lili and her university classmates went to a park for picnicking, but it was raining heavily. <p>Suspicious about Zodiac prediction</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lili and I both have very bad luck in the year of the snake. Different from the prediction. The book says he can have a lot of money, but he didn't earn much money. The book says he might be able to find a girlfriend, but he hasn't got a girlfriend or Lili hasn't agreed to be his girlfriend. Xiaopeng really doesn't know if he should trust Chinese zodiac. 	<p>N1 – I think that Xiaopeng's view is negative. There is always good luck and bad luck in zodiac signs.</p>
	<p>N2 – Xiaopeng believes on Chinese zodiac 100%. I think this book says that people born in year of snake will have bad things happen to them.</p>
	<p>A3 – Chinese and Xiaopeng believe that it is true something bad can happen in the zodiac. Lili went to work and car broken down half way.</p>
	<p>A4 – Xiaopeng doesn't believe in the zodiac because it said his luck would be good but it has so far not happened.</p>
	<p>M5 – 1 justified explanations about money, girlfriend or work. In my opinion Xiaopeng so confused as Lili is born in the year of snake and supposed to have bad luck and him good luck, but both had bad luck. (unsupported by specific details)</p>
	<p>M6 – He is not really sure as whether to believe in the zodiac as his zodiac promised that he would have work opportunities, make money, and get a girlfriend. However this is different to his reality. (Unsupported by further details)</p>
	<p>E7 – Xiaopeng is unsure whether to believe or not as his luck is not predicted correctly as he was supposed to have a girlfriend this year, a good job and earn good money; however, Lili refused to become his girlfriend and he works in a supermarket. Lili's zodiac said she would have bad luck and she has had bad luck with her car and weather.</p>
	<p>E8 – Xiaopeng is conflicted about whether to believe in the zodiac as he is passionate and read a lot from the book about it but his prediction of getting a good job and a girlfriend and earning money have not come true. Lili's predictions of bad luck have come true with her car breaking down and getting caught in the rain, but he is sceptical as his and Lili's luck is much the same. He finally states "he doesn't know if she should believe or not, showing he is very suspicious.</p>

Meimei: There is also very special 'Māori' culture in New Zealand. Meimei very much likes to see Māori people dancing and singing. Māori BBQ (hangi) is quite tasty. However, Meimei didn't understand why Māori people have to touch each other's nose when they greet. Tiantian thought Māori way of greeting (touching noses) is really interesting. Tiantian heard that Māori people are extremely friendly. When they meet friends, they always like to stay closer. Tiantian likes Māori friends even more now than in the past! <p>Telecommunication</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Tiantian: Using cell phones and Internet is more convenient when Tiantian was in China. Making phone calls and using Internet are both very cheap in China. Meimei: Using Internet is not only slower but also more expensive in New Zealand than in China. 	<p>N1 – New Zealand is a beautiful country and has Maori people. China doesn't have Māori people.</p>
	<p>N2 – Electronic devices are cheaper in China. Internet is expensive.</p>
	<p>A3 – Public transport in China is convenient. Internet in New Zealand is expensive, etc.</p>
	<p>A4 – The telecommunication in China is very good compared to New Zealand. New Zealand is very slow and expensive. The transport in China is very good and convenient. She likes to go and buy stuff in the weekends.</p>
	<p>M5 – An attempt to explain whether Tiantian would enjoy the trip with other aspects explained. I think that Tiantian would enjoy the trip because everything about the Māori culture and New Zealand is interesting. The Māori people eat pork, which is delicious.</p>
	<p>M6 – At least one aspect is supported with detail in regard to whether Tiantian would enjoy the trip. I think she would enjoy the trip because she thinks Māori culture is interesting, especially how Māori people press noses when they meet. They are very friendly and she likes them.</p>
	<p>E7 – 2 aspects of likes / dislikes about the holiday, supported by evidence. I think she will enjoy being able to meet Māori people as she says she heard they were very friendly and she likes their customs of touching noses and greeting. She also likes going to the beautiful places that Meimei mentioned, such as mountains etc.</p>
	<p>E8 – At least 2 aspects of likes / dislikes about the holiday, supported by evidence, including contrast reference eg shopping hours. I think she would really enjoy the trip as she is interested in Māori culture and says she thinks Maori people are friendly, and going there is an opportunity for her to make more Māori friends, etc. However, she may miss her friends and find New Zealand shopping hours frustrating during the holiday period. She may also find the internet and telecommunication expensive and frustrating. Overall, however, she will enjoy the trip and the scenery and the culture.</p>

Xiaoyu cooks Chinese food.</p> <p>N2 – little valid information. Xiaoyu is looking for food job. Xiaoyu likes to eat bread.</p> <p>A3 – Any 2 pieces of information that support a correct job suitability section or 3 correct details across sections (Xiaoyu's job or Xiaowen's job). Xiaoyu's job: selling food /job 3: Xiaoyu is good at maths. Job is best for Xiaoyu. Xiaoyu wants to make friends.</p> <p>A4 – Any 3 pieces of information that support a correct job suitability, a complete section or at least 1 important detail from each section. Xiaoyu would be suitable for job 3 in the supermarket as she is good at maths and can help others. She likes to learn and make new friends, which is suitable for the job.</p> <p>M5 – Well explained 2 sections in either job suitability or job unsuitability, with some minor inconsistencies. Work in supermarket section and job unsuitability section explained well with one section containing errors detracting from clear understanding. Xiaowen's job: Work in stadium. Xiaowen very much likes sport, and a job in a sports stadium would suit him as he wants to teach chicken (misspelled children) and loves sport.</p> <p>M6 – Well explained 2 sections for job suitability supported well with details however with last section detracting from thorough understanding. Neither of them would be suitable for job 1 as it requires at least one year of work experience in the workforce (incorrect evidence). Other information for job suitability provided correctly.</p> <p>E7 – Successfully judged which job is not suitable, with 1 well explained piece of evidence and suitable jobs all identified and explained. Work opportunity one is not suitable for Xiaoyu and Xiaowen. They add needs drivers and they have no work experience.</p> <p>E8 – Successfully judged which job is not suitable, with 2 well explained pieces of evidence and suitable jobs all identified and explained. Work opportunity one working in restaurant food delivery as Xiaowen and Xiaoyu both are not suitable for varying reasons. Xiaoyu cannot drive, and it does not state that Xiaowen does. Xiaoyu, though interested and suited to this job, does not have work experience in a restaurant or baking experience. Xiaowen also does not have the experience and it is also not in his field of interest.</p>
