<i>Features</i>	<i>Description</i>
4.41 cm display	See your messages and missed calls and act on them , via Bluetooth connection to Smartphone.
Plays music	Can listen to music with earphones, plays MP3 and also other formats, up to 4MB space. Music helps you to get into the right rhythm when running.
Jogging trainer	Tracks every step, gives you stats, keeps you motivated, <u>stops you losing sight of your sporting goals.</u>
<u>Torch</u>	If running at night.
Photo and video camera	Take photos or videos <u>on the go</u> due to autofocus, HD quality.
Water and dirt resistant	It's dirt- and water-resistant so ideal for outside, also in bad weather.
Remote control	With the help of WatchON-App and sensor, <u>you can control the TV at home.</u>
Battery life	Up to 6 days – very good.
Interchangeable wrist strap and pictures in the clock	Variety in design – avoids boredom.
Weights 68g	Light weight.
