Question	Sample Evidence
(a)	Possible evidence for malnutrition in Timor-Leste being an international health concern:
	Access to adequate food that nourishes is a human right that numerous people in Timor-Leste do not have. The lack of nutrition has ramifications for health and well-being for substantial numbers of people within Timor-Leste. The lack of sustenance means that people are not able to have quality of life nor fulfil their obligations to helping Timor-Leste out of poverty by being employed and raising productivity within the country.
(b) (i) and (ii)	Possible evidence explaining how malnutrition in Timor-Leste is shaped by one major determinant of health, AND how this impacts the well-being of people who are directly affected by malnutrition.
()	Major determinant of health: Political
	Government policy needs to ensure that nutrition is a focus for Timor-Leste. At present, there are not adequate policies to prioritise education or training incentives to teach agricultural techniques to people. This would teach people to grow crops and provide foods that can yield the highest nutritional value possible, and have good financial yields at market. It means that the people of Timor-Leste are not receiving adequate nutrition when there is land that could be producing yields that would help. The physical well-being of people within Timor-Leste is severely impacted by the inadequate nutrition, which results in stunting in children, and low energy levels.
(iii)	Possible evidence recommending one strategy to improve the well-being of people who are directly affected by malnutrition in Timor-Leste (with reference to addressing the determinant of health identified in (b) (i)):
	Government policy to ensure that nutrition is a focus for Timor-Leste will influence the well-being of its people. This could be implemented by the Government reprioritising their budgets to provide training for parents and farmer groups in improved agricultural techniques. This will encourage more superfood production. Providing children in Timor-Leste with access to adequate nutrition means they will not be affected by the stunting that can be seen in large numbers across the country. This would alleviate the number of children affected by acute malnutrition in Timor-Leste.
(c) (i) and (ii)	Possible evidence explaining how malnutrition in Timor-Leste is shaped by one major determinant of health, AND how this impacts the well-being of people and communities who are affected by malnutrition.
	Major determinant of health: Economic
	The level of poverty within Timor-Leste is a major reason why there is malnutrition in Timor-Leste. An inability to sustain food for families is the major contributor to poor health outcomes for all the population of Timor-Leste, but particularly for children whose bodies are still growing. More than half of the people of Timor-Leste live below the poverty line. This means parents cannot provide adequate food for their families. This has massive ramifications in relation to poor nutrition, which then leads on to other health implications, such as poor brain and bone development, which both have long lasting effects. This affects individuals that are directly involved, as they cannot fulfil their potential in relation to learning, gaining employment, and the skills to provide for their families. It also affects society as a whole, because the productivity of the country is reduced.
(iii)	Possible evidence recommending one strategy to improve the well-being of people and communities who are affected by malnutrition in Timor-Leste (with reference to addressing the determinant of health identified in (c) (i)):
	Support from Global organisations such as World Vision and Oxfam, working together with the Timor-Leste Government to access funding for emergency nutrition assistance. This would provide ready-to-use therapeutic foods, which treat children suffering from malnutrition.
