A variety of sources and concepts, as listed in the explanatory notes of the standard, will be used to assess historical skills.

Candidates will be required to write paragraph-length answers.

Candidates will be provided with a resource booklet containing a variety of historical sources, primary and secondary.

The context provided will be **the relationship between individuals and groups with New Zealand's identity in the first half of the twentieth century.**

Title:	Analyse the causes and consequences of a significant historical event

Candidates will be required to write an essay on ONE significant historical event they have studied, using a conventional essay format.

One general essay question will be provided.

Candidates will be expected to analyse a limited number of causes OR consequences of their chosen significant historical event.

There is no prescribed content.

Candidates are encouraged to write a concise response of no more than 800–900 words (5–6 pages). Assessment will be based on the quality of the response rather than its length.

Title:	Analyse a significant historical trend and the force(s) that influenced it

Candidates will be required to write an essay on ONE significant historical trend they have studied, using a conventional essay format.

One general essay question will be provided.

Candidates will be expected to analyse EITHER a trend and its effects OR the forces that have influenced a particular trend.

There is no prescribed content.

Candidates are encouraged to write a concise response of no more than 800–900 words (5–6 pages). Assessment will be based on the quality of the response rather than its length.
