Text choices for both standards will reflect appropriate cultural contexts, for example Chinese-speaking communities, te ao Māori, the Pacific, and Aotearoa New Zealand.

Texts will refer to events or experiences that are familiar and relevant to the candidate.

In Level 1 Chinese (Mandarin) examinations, candidates can respond in English or te reo Māori.
